Mosquitos

Can you believe that a mosquito is the deadliest animal in the world? In fact, according to the World Health Organization, mosquito bites result in the deaths of more than 1 million people every year.

While many of us do not worry about deadly consequences from a mosquito bite, most of us do not enjoy this miniscule animal in our lives.

Mosquitos can breed in an area as little as a teaspoon of standing water. So, what can you do to prevent mosquitos in your community? Take preventative measures to reduce or eliminate the source. Send notice to your owners asking them to check their property for items like bird baths, planters, small toys, and bromeliads that can all hold enough standing water for mosquitos to lay their eggs. In addition, check your gutters and drainage ditches to be sure that they are free flowing.

Outdoor Water Conservation Tips

It's everyone's responsibility to conserve and protect water

resources. The decisions and actions we take affect our water resources for the future. The following suggestions will help you get in the habit of saving water in the great outdoors:

- Use a rain guage to measure rainfall. One inch
 of rain per week is generally sufficient for lawns
 and gardens. Supplement only when rainfall is
 inadequate.
- Use mulch around landscaping; it eliminates weeds and holds moisture in the soil.
- Select hardy plants that don't need much water.
 Plants native to our climate and soils will survive well without supplemental watering.
- Water during the cool part of the day to avoid rapid evaporation.
- Raise the mowing heights on your lawn mower.
 This promotes heathier grass that has a better chance to survive dry periods.
- When watering is necessary, water slowly and thoroughly. If puddles form or water runs off, slow down and wait for water to soak in. Be sure your spinkler puts water where you need it-not on driveways or sidewalks.
- Wash cars efficiently. Use a bucket and sponge, and don't let the water run while you scrub.
